Next Saturday, the 18th of September, is World Amateur Radio Day.

In Sweden, the top Morse code speed requirement has been cut from 12 to 5 words per minute. The Swedish authorities have also reduced the number of licence classes from four to two. The new Swedish class 1 licence offers all Swedish amateur privileges and requires a 5 words per minute test, while the class 2 ticket is a no-code licence for VHF and UHF. In addition, Sweden reportedly has a new three-year non-renewable 'study licence' that offers full and unsupervised VHF and UHF facilities.

Jamboree on the Air - the annual Scout and Guides special event weekend - takes place this year on 16th and 17th October.

The Worked All Britain 144 MHz phone contest takes place next Sunday, the 19th of September, from 0900 to 1700 UTC.
